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Aims and priorities of Strategic Partnerships

Key Action 2: Cooperation for Innovation and the Exchange of Good Practices



Strategic Partnerships aim to support the development, transfer and/or implementation of innovative practices as well as the implementation of joint initiatives promoting cooperation, peer learning and exchanges of experience at European level.

Field-specific priorities: higher education



The most important:

- To improve the quality and relevance of higher education;
- To equip the young generation with transversal skills such as creativeness and entrepreneurship, by developing active cooperation between Universities and partners from outside academia: enterprises, local/regional bodies etc.

Who can participate?

- **Programme Countries:** all EU member states, Norway, former Yugoslavia, Macedonia, Iceland, Lichtenstein, Turkey

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Number of project partners

- Minimum 3 organisations from 3 different Programme Countries.

Duration of the project

- 24-36 months

Eligible participants

- **Students registered in a participating Universities**
- **Professors, teachers, trainers, educational and administrative staff working in the participating organisations.**

Project budget

- **Up to 300 000 EUR (for a 2 year project)**
- **Up to 450 000 EUR (for a 3 year project)**

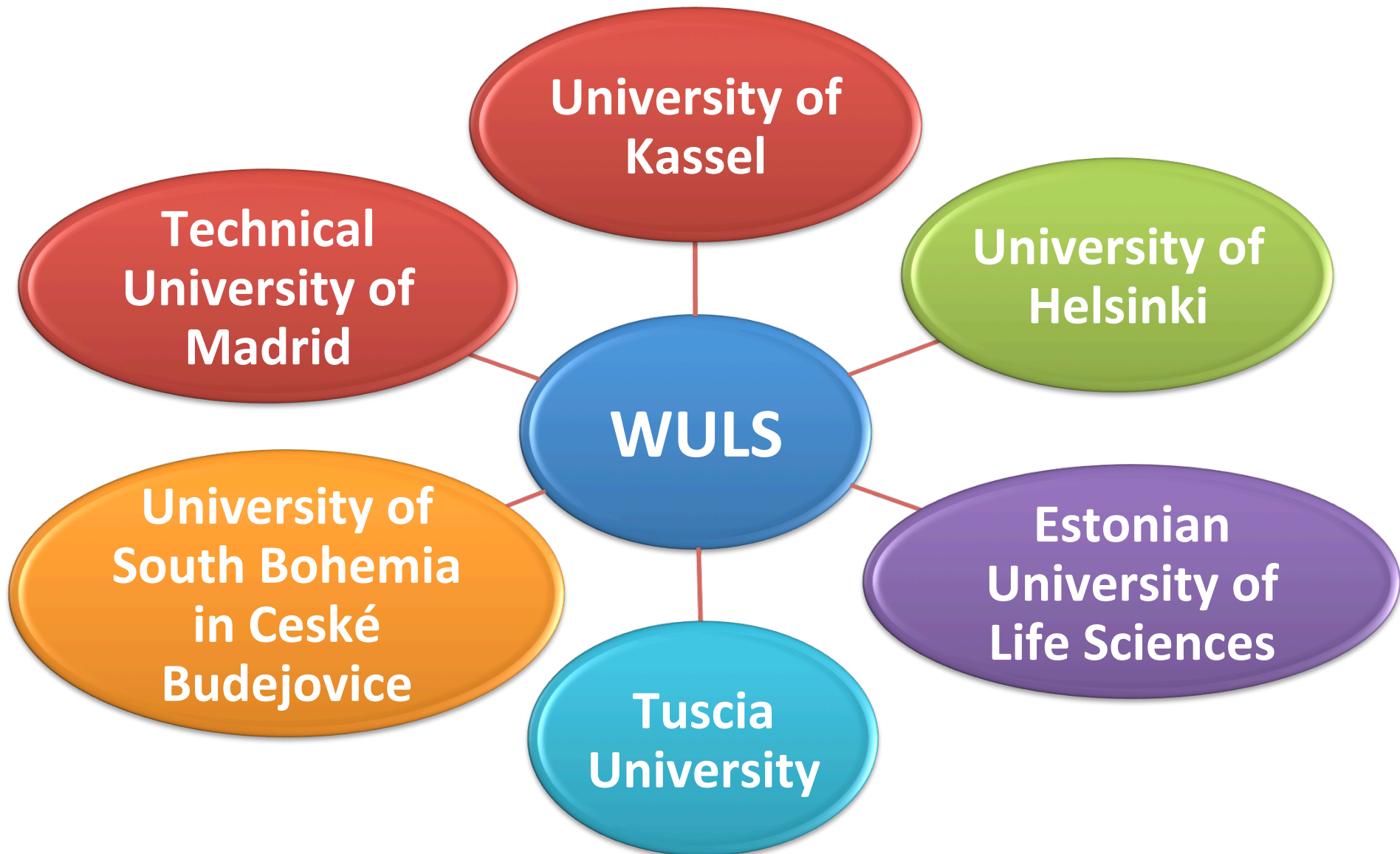

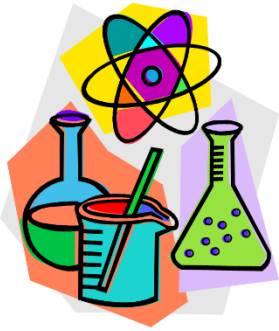
Structure of the Partnership (EPOS)

Scientific aspects of both projects

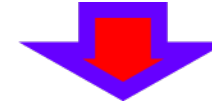
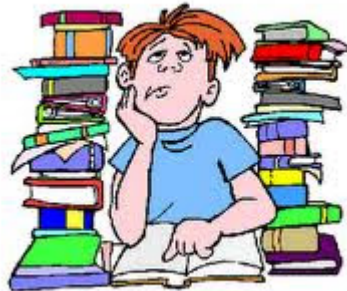
