#### Visit to 7 villages of BERAS India

From the 12<sup>th</sup> to the 27<sup>th</sup> of November 2017 Astrid Kjellevold Hertwig, Raymond Auerbach (in Ladakh) and Jostein Hertwig visited seven villages of BERAS India. "It was truly an honour to be with our colleagues in BERAS India. To learn more about their daily life, farming and food culture, sharing challenges and opportunities in an atmosphere of kindness and hospitality. The trip started in Ladakh in the Himalayas and the visit to Takmachik Eco Village supported by the team of Dr. Mohammed Deen. Then we continued to Tamil Nadu and Jezreel Farms and other initiatives in Ooty (Mahesh Melvin), Kudumbam in Trichy with farm visits etc. (Oswald Quintal, Suresh Kanna), Inba Seva Sangam and related projects in Sevapur/ Karur (Dr. Perumal), CIRHEP, Natural Resource Management in Nilakottai (Mr. Mohan and Ms. Chandra), Karmuhil farms and gardens in Pudupatti/ Madurai (Fr Clement Joseph and Mr. Anbusivan). We concluded our visit to BERAS villages in EcoPro and Annapurna farm in Auroville (Dr. Lucas Dengel and Mr. Krishnamoorthy). The core work of BERAS India is building Local Sustainable Food Societies (LSFS) involving all actors in the food system from farmers to consumers, local authorities, research, education initiatives and NGOs. It is based on the local context of environmental, societal, cultural, economic and legal framework. Following my visit, I am happy to say that the work of BERAS India in the 7 villages represents valuable examples of Organic food systems as models and living laboratories for transformation processes towards sustainable food systems." ### Organic Food System Programme grows inclusively worldwide

At the 19<sup>th</sup> Organic World Congress, held this November in New Delhi, the Organic Food System Programme held a daylong pre-conference where this SFSP Core Initiative continued extending its global reach. Over 150 participants from 29 countries and all continents had lively and inspiring exchanges on the theory, development, and practical implementation of sustainable production and consumption systems based on organic principles and practices. A range of best practice examples were showcased, including government-led approaches from South Korea. France, and Sweden; private-sector collectives and producer-consumer networks from India, Italy, and Germany; developing food movements in Peru, Canada, and Kenya; education initiatives in India and Europe; globalized food system analysis spanning from China to Denmark; and scientific and social dietary impact studies from the Mediterranean and Nordic regions. OFSP continues its rapid growth with new partners joining all the time.
